Will you help families separated by deportation?

The East Central Ohio Sanctuary Network is establishing a Companions/Compañeros Program to assist families who will soon be separated by deportation. Many times, parents are forced to leave their children in the United States and require assistance navigating the legal process, establishing guardianship, transferring assets, accessing community resources, and providing assistance to the children left behind.

These families need someone who will walk with them through this complex maze of issues, emotions and strains while facing deportation. ECOSN is looking for willing individuals who will share their talents to support our immigrant brothers and sisters whose families are impacted by deportation.

The time commitment is approximately 1 to 2 hours per week. A basic knowledge of Spanish is helpful but not necessary. Volunteers for this program will be walking with these families as they prepare for deportation.
